AN OLD "FOURTH."

The President's Great-Grandfather in Newington.

The Rev. Aaron Cleveland, the great-grandfather of President Cleveland, preached in Newington for about a year in the Congregational church, as a temporary pastor in the interval between the long pastorates of the Revs. Joshua Belden and Joab Brace. The last sermon of Mr. Belden was preached November 6, 1803, and the first sermon of Mr. Brace was preached October 7, 1804, and between these dates the pulpit was supplied by Mr. Cleveland. The ordination of Mr. Brace took place January 16, 1805, and Mr. Cleveland was one of the ministers present as a member of the ordaining council. He had a son William, born December 20, 1770, and he had a son, Richard Falley Cleveland, who graduated at Yale in 1824, and was the father of Grover Cleveland. To what extent the latter owes his elevation to the presidency to the fact that his great-grandfather preached in Newington, is not ascertained, but it is certain that the great-grandfather enjoyed his relation as pastor over the Newington church, and to demonstrate it we extract from our own files of July 18, 1804, an account of a Fourth of July celebration in Newington, in which he took a prominent part:—

WETHERSFIELD SOCIETY OF NEWINGTON,
July 7, 1804.

"The anniversary of American Independence was celebrated in this place under the presidency of Colonel Levi Lusk and Captain Absalom Welles. Captain Robert Francis, with his military company in uniform, attended on the occasion. At 2 o'clock p. m. the inhabitants assembled at the meeting-house, where social prayer and praise were performed, and a sermon suitable to the occasion was delivered by the Rev. Aaron Cleveland from Mark iii, 24: "If a kingdom be divided against itself that kingdom cannot stand." The sermon being over the sons of liberty marched in procession, Captain Francis and company in front, to the house of Mrs. Blin, where a handsome dinner was provided. After a temperate regalement a number of patriotic toasts were drunk with the discharge of musquetry. Their dispersion at 6 o'clock witnessed their decorum and good order."

We can well believe that the minister attended the "regalement," drank to the toasts, "dispersed" in good order for those days, and then wrote this account for THE COURANT.
